

Petition for redress of grievances

Article one in the Bill of Rights states that “Congress shall make no law.....abridging the right of the people peaceably to assemble and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.”

The undersigned has/have peaceably assembled with others in the town squares of Wisconsin for said purpose.

1/ Whereas the political parties have failed us by becoming entirely partisan. They have failed to act in the spirit of our constitutional republic. They have failed to follow standards of decency, protocol, civility and decorum.

2/ Whereas the courts have become partisan, failing to adhere to the rule of law as established in the Constitution and to the laws passed by the legislature and signed into law.

3/ Whereas the executive branch has failed to enforce existing law by failing to remove inactive or ineligible voters from the ERIC voting rolls per Wisconsin law. To maintain a representative republic, it is necessary to have faith in the integrity of the voting system.

4/ Whereas the state government has failed to correct the crime situation and poor quality of public education in the inner city of Milwaukee.

5/ Whereas the state Department of Public Instruction has failed with only 40% of students able to read or do math at grade level.

6/ Whereas the state government has allowed rioting, destruction and vandalism in Kenosha and our beautiful Capital city of Madison in 2020.

7/ Whereas state government offices remain closed even though the pandemic has ebbed, with business being conducted behind closed doors, all while most people that work for government have never missed a paycheck, faced reduced wages or lacked for other benefits.

8/ Whereas government should consider the rights of working persons including small business owners.

9/ Whereas government has failed to govern frugally, efficiently and honestly.

10/ Whereas the government has exceeded its authority with unlawful mask mandates.

11/ Whereas our schools must be reopened fully with in-classroom instruction.

12/ Whereas social media is a de facto public utility and should be treated as such.

13/ Whereas the mayors of Green Bay and Milwaukee suppressed the vote in the April 2020 primary election in Wisconsin by closing all but 2 and 5 polling stations respectively.

15/ Whereas when any form of government becomes destructive to our republic, it is the right of the people to alter or abolish it and institute new government in such to insure their pursuit of happiness, liberty and safety.

16/ Whereas we welcome hard working, legal immigrants, the federal government has failed to enforce existing immigration law on the southern border.

17/ Whereas our vision is for a peaceful and prosperous country with opportunity for all, with malice towards none and to do no harm.

Be it therefore resolved that we, the undersigned citizen(s) of the State of Wisconsin and the United States of America, do hereby request and demand that these grievances be recognized and acted upon, and if not, to elect representatives that will do so, or any other such action as we deem necessary to effect said results.

Instructions for Petition for Redress of Grievances

1. The petition can be signed individually or en masse.
2. If signed individually, include a personalized handwritten note to the recipient.
3. In your note, indicate your top three issues. Also request what the recipient has done or is doing on any of these issues. Then ask the recipient what their top three issues are.
4. Send via USPS. Enclose a one dollar bill indicating that it is to be used to offset the cost of a return mail response.
5. Do a followup if you do not get a response in a reasonable amount of time.
6. If signed en masse, be sure to include who the response should go to.
